

Lisa Stewart

In May 2012, Lisa Stewart was appointed Director of the Initiative for Business in Society (IBiS) at the University of Virginia's Darden School of Business. IBiS aims to be a leading global catalyst and convener of thought, information and action at the interface of business and society, and to promote the development of leaders to positively impact society through their roles in business. Stewart is responsible for leading significant activities and programs in supporting IBiS's deliverables and mission, as well as the external coordination between academic educators and industry leaders.

Having joined the Darden School in 1999, Stewart most recently served as Associate Director of the Business Roundtable Institute for Corporate Ethics, where she frequently collaborated with faculty and business executives, and managed issue-driven projects and programs. In her role with the Institute, Stewart co-authored several papers and reports focused on business ethics for a practitioner audience, in conjunction with leading academics in the field of business ethics. A few sample publications include: "Developing Ethical Leadership" and "Shaping Tomorrow's Business Leaders: Principles and Practices for a Model Business Ethics Program," and "Teaching Business Ethics in the Age of Madoff." Stewart also produced a Corporate Ethics video series, available on YouTube, highlighting the expertise of many leading academics working in the field of business ethics.

As a graduate of the University of Virginia with a B.A. in African-American Studies, Stewart has also worked with several Virginia nonprofit organizations in both development and special events. She lives in central Virginia with her spouse and two young children.
